


On the back of this comic she wrote "Papa and Harry slept on ground. Aunt Aggie Kendrick, Mother and I slept in car."









Mr. Jarboe was a member of a pioneer family of the Old Clinton community in Monroe County where his grandparents came from Kentucky and settled on a large farm which was operated with the labor of slaves before the Civil War. This farm remained in the hands of the Jarboe family until the death in 1913 of Joseph M. Jarboe, father of J. A. Jarboe. Mr. and Mrs. Jarboe moved to Monroe City 18 years ago.

Mr. Jarboe was the father of nine daughters, all living except one who died in infancy. Only one daughter, Mrs. Orville Hagan, of Seguin, Tex., was unable to attend the funeral rites. Those attending from a distance included Mr. and Mrs. Larry Carlson and son, Monty, of Minneapolis, Minn., Mr. and Mrs. Gerald Montgomery and children, Jerry, Molly and Judy, and Mr. and Mrs. Joe Jarboe and daughter, Rebecca, of St. Louis, Mrs. Della Jarboe Reams and son, Tommy Dell, of Kirksville, and Miss Anna Lou Jarboe of Bevier.
